

VOTING BY ABSENTEE BALLOT

Any qualified elector who is unable or unwilling to appear at the polling place on Election Day may request to vote an absentee ballot. A qualified elector is any U.S. citizen, who will be 18 years of age or older on Election Day, who has resided in the ward or municipality where he or she wishes to vote for at least 10 consecutive days before the election. The elector must also be registered in order to receive an absentee ballot. **Proof of identification must be provided before an absentee ballot may be issued.**

You must make a request for an absentee ballot in writing.

Contact your municipal clerk and request that an application for an absentee ballot be sent to you for the primary or election or both. You may also submit a written request in the form of a letter. Your written request must list your voting address within the municipality where you wish to vote, the address where the absentee ballot should be sent, if different, and your signature. You may make application for an absentee ballot by mail, email or in person.

MAKING AN APPLICATION TO RECEIVE AN ABSENTEE BALLOT BY MAIL:

**The deadline for making application to receive an absentee by mail is:
5 pm on the fifth day before the election, Friday, June 8, 2018.**

Note: Special absentee voting application provisions apply to electors who are indefinitely confined to home or a care facility, in the military, hospitalized, or serving as a sequestered juror. If this applies to you, contact the municipal clerk regarding deadlines for requesting and submitting an absentee ballot.

VOTING AN ABSENTEE BALLOT IN PERSON

You may also request and vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office or other specified location during the days and hours specified for casting an absentee ballot in person.

The first day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office is:

The last day to vote an absentee ballot in the clerk's office:

Thursday, June 7, 2018 last appointment will be scheduled no later than 5:00 P.M.

No in-person absentee voting may occur on the day before the election.

Requesting an absentee ballot through myvote.wi.gov

Registered voters may request an absentee ballot by visiting myvote.wi.gov and clicking on "Vote Absentee". Follow the prompts given and your request will be emailed to your municipal clerk.

The municipal clerk will deliver voted ballots returned on or before Election Day to the proper polling place or counting location before the polls close on June 12, 2018. Any ballots received after the polls close will not be counted.

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Notice to voters: If you are voting on Election Day, your ballot must be initiated by two election inspectors. If you are voting absentee, your ballot must be initiated by the municipal clerk or deputy clerk. Your ballot may not be counted without initials. (See end of ballot for initials)

Instructions to Voters

If you make a mistake on your ballot or have a question, ask an election inspector for help. (Absentee voters: Contact your municipal clerk.)

To vote for a name on the ballot, fill in the oval next to the name like this

To vote for a name that is not on the ballot, write the name on the line marked "write-in" and fill in the oval next to the name like this
